New Case Based Forensic Accounting Class Will Give Students An Inside Look At How Real Cases Are Investigated.

Los Angeles, CA- Jan. 7, 2010- Today marks the beginning of a new Case Based forensic accounting class being taught at California State University Los Angeles. "This class offers students an inside look at how real fraud cases are investigated" said Max P. Liphart, CPA and Director of Operations at PCG Consultants.
